An Act Providing for a Noncommercial, Nondomiciled Resident Lobster and Crab Fishing License

15 16 17 18	5. Eligibility. A noncommercial or student lobster and crab fishing license may only be issued to an individual who is a resident <u>or a nondomiciled resident</u> . A Class I, Class II or Class III license may be issued to a person 17 years of age or older only if the person:
19 20	A. Possessed a Class I, Class II or Class III lobster and crab fishing license in the previous calendar year;
21	C. Meets the requirements of the apprentice program under section 6422; or
22 23 24	D. Did not possess a Class I, Class II or Class III lobster and crab fishing license in the previous calendar year because the commissioner had suspended the person's license privileges for a length of time that included the previous calendar year.
25 26 27 28	Notwithstanding the age requirements of this subsection, a person who holds a Class I, Class II or Class III license on December 31, 2007 may continue to be issued a Class I, Class II or Class III license provided that person continues to meet the requirements of paragraph A.

31 32 33 34	5-B. Noncommercial, nondomiciled resident lobster and crab fishing license eligibility. Beginning with license year 2003 2013, a noncommercial, nondomiciled resident lobster and crab fishing license may be issued only to a person who, at the time of application, is 8 years of age or older and has:
35 36	A. Successfully completed a lobster and crab fishing written examination, as provided in section 6423; or

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

D. If registered to vote, is registered in the State;

at least one of the motor vehicles in the State; and

C. Pays income tax to the State;

A. Owns property in the State on which property taxes are paid;

E. If licensed to drive a motor vehicle, is licensed in the State;

30-B. Nondomiciled resident. "Nondomiciled resident" means a person who:

B. Resides in the State for more than 3 months but less than 6 months each year;

F. If the owner of one or more motor vehicles located within the State, has registered

G. When licensed to fish under this Part, fishes on a vessel that is registered in the

1 2	B. Held a Class I, Class II or Class III lobster and crab fishing license and has landed lobster under that license.
3 4	Once a person successfully completes the examination, that person need not repeat the examination to renew the license.

19	SUMMARY
20 21 22	This bill creates a noncommercial, nondomiciled resident lobster and crab fishing license. The holders of these licenses are charged \$250 for a license and an annual surcharge of \$1,000 designated to the Lobster Promotion Fund.
