21 22	1. <b>Definitions.</b> As used in this section, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
23	A. "Cellular telephone" means a device used to access a wireless telephone service.
24 25 26 27	2. Prominence of instructions. If a cellular telephone manufacturer includes guidelines or instructions or general information relating to radio-frequency exposure in any literature distributed or made available to consumers in connection with its products, the cellular telephone manufacturer shall ensure that:
28 29	A. The full language of the radio-frequency exposure guidelines or instructions or general information is plainly visible on the outside of the product packaging; or
30 31	B. A label is plainly visible on the outside of the product packaging alerting consumers to the radio-frequency exposure guidelines or instructions or general

1	information. The body of the notice must be in letters not less than 1/16 inch in
2	height. The initial words "RF EXPOSURE" must appear in capital letters and in bold
3	type at least 1/8 inch in height, followed by: "To find information relating to radio-
4	frequency exposure, refer to information supplied by the manufacturer" and language
5	directing consumers to the page or pages of the owner's manual or other insert or
6	location where the radio-frequency exposure guidelines or instructions or general
7	information may be found.
8	3. Violation. A violation of this chapter is a violation of the Maine Unfair Trade
9	Practices Act.'
10	SUMMARY
11	This amendment replaces the bill. It requires that any notification related to radio-
12	frequency exposure supplied by a cellular telephone manufacturer must have the
10	language of the notification plainly visible on the outside of the product peakeging or a
13	language of the notification plainly visible on the outside of the product packaging or a
13 14	label, plainly visible on the outside of the product packaging directing the consumer
14	label, plainly visible on the outside of the product packaging, directing the consumer
14 15	label, plainly visible on the outside of the product packaging, directing the consumer where to find the information. A violation of this provision is a violation of the Maine
