SUMMARY

- This amendment replaces the bill. The bill proposes to remove the mapped habitat provision in the exemption for forest management activities under the Natural Resources Protection Act. The amendment directs the Department of Environmental Protection to amend its rules to:
- Provide that if a vernal pool depression is bisected by a property boundary, only
 that portion of the vernal pool depression located on the property of the landowner
 proposing to cause an impact may be considered in determining whether the vernal pool
 is significant;
- 2. Provide that an artificial vernal pool is exempt from regulation as long as the
 vernal pool was not created in connection with a compensation project; and
- 33 3. Remove seasonal precipitation as a factor in determining that a vernal pool habitat
 34 is not significant.

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
