15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23	Except as otherwise provided by municipal charter or ordinance, the municipal officers may authorize the chief of police or other designee to request other municipalities to provide <u>police law enforcement</u> officers to assist the requesting municipality. <u>The county commissioners may authorize the sheriff or other designee to request a municipality to provide law enforcement officers to assist the requesting county.</u> The municipal officers may authorize the chief of police or other designee to provide <u>police law enforcement</u> officers to assist the requesting county. The municipal officers may authorize the chief of police or other designee to provide <u>police law enforcement</u> officers to assist other municipalities <u>or counties</u> when so requested by a properly authorized chief of police, <u>sheriff</u> or other designee of the requesting municipality <u>or county</u> .
24 25 26 27 28 29	The authorizations of the municipal officers <u>or county commissioners</u> must be accompanied by an agreement between the requesting municipality <u>or county</u> and the responding municipality <u>or county</u> that specifies which <del>municipality</del> governmental entity is liable, if any liability is determined to exist, for personal injury or property damage caused by or occurring to the <del>police</del> <u>law enforcement</u> officers of the responding municipality <u>or county</u> in the course of assisting the requesting municipality <u>or county</u> .
30 31 32 33 34 35 36	If the request for assistance is for a major unplanned incident that jeopardizes the health and welfare of the citizens of the requesting municipality <u>or county</u> and when delay may cause further jeopardy to life or property or in the case of jointly planned collaborative activity, the police chief of any municipality <u>or sheriff of any county</u> or the chief's <u>or sheriff's</u> designee may request assistance from or provide assistance to another municipality or law enforcement agency whether or not an agreement between the 2 municipalities or parties exists. Each <u>police law enforcement</u> department shall assume its

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own liability to a 3rd party, except for liability incurred by the command or operational decisions made by the requesting department, which must be assumed by the requesting department. For the purposes of this paragraph, "major unplanned incident" means an extraordinary emergency to which a law enforcement agency is unable to adequately respond that presents a substantial and imminent danger to the public safety and that necessitates the cooperation or assistance of other law enforcement agencies.

7 The <u>police law enforcement</u> officers of the responding municipality <u>or county</u> or law 8 enforcement agency have the same authority as <u>police law enforcement</u> officers within 9 the limits of the requesting municipality <u>or county</u>, except as to the service of civil 10 process<u></u> and, when assisting other municipalities, have the same privileges and 11 immunities as when acting within their own jurisdiction.'

## **SUMMARY**

13 This amendment adds to the bill to provide that county commissioners may authorize 14 the sheriff or other designee to request that a municipality provide law enforcement officers to assist the requesting county and that municipal law enforcement officers may 15 be authorized to assist a requesting county. The amendment also provides that the 16 authorization from the county commissioners must be accompanied by an agreement 17 between the requesting municipality or county and the responding municipality or county 18 that specifies who is liable if any liability exists for personal injury or property damage 19 caused by or occurring to the law enforcement officers. The amendment also provides 20 21 that the sheriff or a sheriff's designee may request assistance from or provide assistance to a municipality or law enforcement agency whether or not an agreement between the 2 22 parties exists if the request is for assistance in a major unplanned incident that jeopardizes 23 the health and welfare of the citizens of the requesting municipality or county. 24

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
