1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §8704, sub-§1, ¶ E, as amended by PL 2013, c. 40, §1, is further amended to read:
4	E. Eight members appointed by the Governor as follows:
5 6	(1) One member from the Maine Educational Center for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing and the Governor Baxter School for the Deaf;
7	(2) One member from a statewide association for the deaf;
8 9	(3) One member from a center on deafness disability rights organization in this <u>State</u> ;
10 11	(4) One member from the largest incumbent local exchange carrier providing telecommunications relay service in this State;
12 13 14	(5) One member of a telephone association in this State, except that the representative under this subparagraph may not be a representative of the carrier under subparagraph (4);
15 16 17 18	(6) Two members from the general public who use telecommunications devices for the deaf as a primary means of that operate in connection with telecommunications relay services as their primary means of telecommunications; and
19 20 21 22	(7) One member representing an Internet telecommunications relay service provider a company that provides service to customers in this State telecommunications relay services through the Internet, wireless telecommunications or cable telecommunications.
23	SUMMARY
24 25 26 27	This bill changes the qualifications of 4 members of the Telecommunications Relay Services Advisory Council to reflect changes in the State regarding advocates for persons with disabilities, telecommunications relay services and the Internet and wireless and cable telecommunications.
