32 33	<b>1.</b> State Compensation Commission; membership. The State Compensation Commission, established in Title 5, section 12004-G, subsection 26-D and referred to in

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this section as the "commission," "the commission," consists of 5 members appointed,
 except as provided in subsection 6, in January of every odd-numbered year at the first
 regular session of each Legislature as follows:

- A. Two members appointed by the President of the Senate;
- B. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
- 6 C. One member appointed by a majority of the members appointed under paragraphs 7 A and B, who serves as chair of the commission.
- 8 The 5 members must be residents of the State and appointed from the public. A person 9 may not be appointed who is currently or has previously been a Legislator or a legislative 10 employee.
- 11 All Except as provided in subsection 6, all members must be appointed for a term to 12 coincide with the legislative biennium. A vacancy must be filled in the same manner as 13 the original appointment for the balance of the unexpired term.
- 14 The members of the commission are entitled to a per diem, expenses and allowances at 15 the same rate as Legislators.
- 16 2. Duties of commission. No Except as provided in subsection 6, no later than May 1st of every odd-numbered year and January 15th of every even-numbered year the 17 commission shall submit to the Legislature an interim report of the commission, and no 18 later than November 15th of every even-numbered year the commission shall submit to 19 20 the Legislature a final report of the commission. In the 3rd year of each gubernatorial term of office, the interim report must contain a recommendation for compensation of the 21 Governor as established in Title 2, section 1. A report under this subsection must 22 23 contain:
- 24 A. A description of the commission's activities;
- 25 B. The recommendations of the commission:

(1-A) For the report required in the 3rd year of a gubernatorial term, for
compensation for the Governor, including all payments for salaries, meals,
housing, travel, mileage, constituent services and all other expenses and
allowances;

(1-B) For compensation for justices and judges, including all payments for
salaries, meals, housing, travel, mileage and all other expenses and allowances,
and for additional services by any justice or judge. Nothing in this subparagraph
prevents the judicial branch from making recommendations to the Governor or
Legislature for compensation for justices and judges, including, but not limited
to, recommendations made by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court in
preparing the budget of the judicial branch as required by Title 4, section 1; and

(1-C) For compensation of Legislators, representatives of Indian tribes, Secretary
and Assistant Secretary of the Senate and Clerk and Assistant Clerk of the House
of Representatives, including all payments for salaries, meals, housing, travel,
mileage, constituent services and all other expenses and allowances, and for
additional services by the President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of
Representatives and members of legislative leadership;

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1 C. The reasons for its recommendations; 2 D. Drafts of any legislation required to implement its recommendations; and 3 E. Any other material and recommendations that commission members may wish to 4 submit 5 Before reporting as required in this subsection and subsequent to giving public notice, the commission shall hold a public hearing on the report. Subsequent to reporting, the 6 commission shall meet, if requested, with the Governor, the Legislative Council and 7 8 legislative committees to discuss the report. 9 3. Appointments; meetings. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council 10 must be notified by the presiding officers once the appointment of the initial 4 members has been made. Within 15 days of the appointment of the initial 4 members, the Chair of 11 the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission. 12 13 4. Staff assistance. The commission shall request staff assistance from the Legislative Council. 14 5. Legislation. The commission may submit legislation required to implement its 15 recommendations. 16 17 6. Convening of commission in September 2018. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the commission must be appointed and convened, and shall 18 undertake a review and submit a report in accordance with this subsection. 19 20 A. No later than September 1, 2018, the appointing authorities set forth in subsection 1 shall appoint the 5 members of the commission in accordance with the requirements 21 22 set forth in subsection 1. 23 B. 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#### **SUMMARY** 1 2 This amendment clarifies that the increase in the Governor's salary contained in the 3 bill will not affect the calculation of the retirement allowance of the current Governor. The amendment also increases the daily maximum mileage allowance for Legislators 4 5 from \$38 to \$75, which aligns with the increase in the daily maximum housing allowance 6 proposed in the bill. 7 This amendment requires that, no later than September 1, 2018, the State Compensation Commission be appointed and convened and that the commission review 8 9 the compensation of Legislators, representatives of Indian tribes, Secretary and Assistant Secretary of the Senate and Clerk and Assistant Clerk of the House of Representatives 10 and submit a report that includes its recommendations to the Legislature by January 2, 11 2019. 12 13 The amendment also adds an appropriations and allocations section. **FISCAL NOTE REQUIRED** 14 15 (See attached)

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
