1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 29-A MRSA §2054, sub-§9, as amended by PL 2007, c. 348, §20, is further amended to read:
4 5 6 7	9. Stationary vehicles. The operator of a vehicle passing a stationary authorized emergency vehicle using an emergency light, a stationary public utility emergency service vehicle using its authorized lights or a stationary wrecker using its authorized lights, with due regard to the safety and traffic conditions, shall:
8 9	A. Pass in a lane not adjacent to that of the authorized emergency vehicle, <u>public</u> <u>utility emergency service vehicle</u> or wrecker, if possible; or
10 11 12 13	B. If passing in a nonadjacent lane is impossible or unsafe, pass the emergency vehicle, <u>public utility emergency service vehicle</u> or wrecker at a careful and prudent speed reasonable for passing the authorized emergency vehicle, <u>public utility emergency service vehicle</u> or wrecker safely.
14 15	A violation of this subsection is a traffic infraction for which a minimum fine of \$250 must be adjudged.
16	SUMMARY
17 18	This bill adds public utility emergency service vehicles to the list of stationary vehicles for which a motorist must move to a nonadjacent lane, if possible, or slow down.
