| 15 | This amendment strikes and replaces the bill. It creates a new moose hunting permit       |
| 16 | lottery system for hunting outfitters, who may sell or transfer the permits as part of an |
| 17 | eating, lodging and hunting package. The permits made available for this lottery, if any, |
| 18 | will come from 10% of the number of permits that exceed 3,140, which is the total         |
| 19 | number of moose hunting permits issued in 2010. Individuals hunting with permits          |
| 20 | issued under this system must hunt with a licensed Maine guide. Proceeds of the new       |
| 21 | lottery system will be allocated to youth conservation education programs under certain   |
| 22 | conditions and any remainder will be allocated to the Moose Research and Management       |

Fund.

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
