1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2 3	Sec. 1. 19-A MRSA §951-A, sub-§2, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1999, c. 634, §3, is repealed.
4	Sec. 2. 19-A MRSA §951-A, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:
5 6	<u>2-A.</u> Amount of award. Unless agreed by the parties, a court may not award more than 30% of an obligor's income under subsection 2.
7 8	Sec. 3. 19-A MRSA §951-A, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1999, c. 634, §3, is amended to read:
9 10 11 12	3. Methods of payment; term and limitations. The order must state the method or methods of payment that the court determines just, including, but not limited to, lump-sum and installment payments. The order must also state the term of and any limitations on the award that the court determines just, including, but not limited to:
13	A. A limit on any increases or decreases in the amount of support;
14	B. A limit on any increases or decreases in the term of support;
15	C. A limit on the method or methods of payment of support;
16	D. A limit on the payment of support related to the remarriage of the payee; and
17	E. A limit on the payment of support related to cohabitation by the payee.
18	The term of an order under this section may not exceed 4 years.
19	Sec. 4. 19-A MRSA §951-A, sub-§13 is enacted to read:
20 21	13. Submission of financial information. Each party shall provide annually to the court an affidavit showing that party's income and assets.
22	Sec. 5. 19-A MRSA §954, sub-§1, ¶G is enacted to read:
23 24 25	G. A withholding order may withhold up to 30% of an obligor's disposable income for amounts owed that are not in arrearage and up to 35% of an obligor's disposable income for amounts owed that are in arrearage.
26	SUMMARY
27	This bill amends the laws governing spousal support in divorce actions by:
28	1. Repealing the provision allowing the awarding of general support;
29 30	2. Unless agreed to by the parties, limiting the amount of support a court may order to no more than 30% of the obligor's income;
31	3. Limiting the term of a support order to 4 years;

4. Limiting the amount of a withholding order to no more than 30% of a obligor's income and, if the award is based upon an agreement of the parties, no more than 35% for amounts owed that are in arrearage; and

5. Requiring the parties annually to submit financial affidavits to the court.
