1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 7 MRSA c. 533 is enacted to read:
3	CHAPTER 533
4	<u>LIABILITY</u>
5	§2881. Liability of apiary owner or operator
6 7 8 9	The owner or operator of an apiary is not liable for personal or property damage that occurs in connection with the operation of that apiary, including the keeping and maintaining of honeybees and honeybee equipment, queen breeding equipment, apiaries and appliances, as long as:
10	1. Licensed. The apiary is licensed pursuant to section 2701; and
11 12	2. Operation and practice. The apiary is operated in good faith, in a reasonable manner and in conformance with best management practices.
13	<u>§2882. Rules</u>
14 15 16	The commissioner shall adopt rules to establish best management practices for the operation of apiaries. Rules adopted pursuant to this section are routine technical rules as defined in Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter 2-A.
17	SUMMARY
18 19 20 21 22	This bill exempts the owner or operator of an apiary from liability for personal or property damage arising from the operation of that apiary as long as the apiary is licensed and is operated in good faith, in a reasonable manner and in conformance with best management practices, as determined by the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources.
