17 18	1. The State Fire Marshal shall, at a minimum, include as members of the stakeholder group:
19	A. The Commissioner of Public Safety or the commissioner's designee;
20 21	B. The Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry or the commissioner's designee;
22 23	C. The Director of the Bureau of Forestry within the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry or the director's designee;
24	D. A representative of a statewide organization representing the interests of farmers;
25	E. A representative of a statewide equine protection organization;
26	F. A representative of a statewide animal welfare organization;
27	G. A veterinarian;
28	H. An owner of a business that sells consumer fireworks in the State; and
29	I. A representative of a statewide organization representing municipal interests.
30 31	2. The stakeholder group shall review and conduct research on matters relating to the impacts of consumer fireworks use in the State including, but not limited to:

A review of the decibel levels of consumer fireworks sold in the State, including how the decibel level of a firework can impact humans, pets, livestock and wildlife, and a review of documented reports since the enactment of Public Law 2011, chapter 416 of harm to animals caused directly or indirectly by the use of consumer fireworks; B. A survey of residents of the State to identify concerns and negative experiences with
6 7 8 9	consumer fireworks use;  C. A review of laws of other jurisdictions regulating the use of consumer fireworks, including any laws requiring a user of consumer fireworks to notify abutters or nearby persons prior to use; and
10 11 12	D. An analysis of methods and the feasibility of implementing a notification system in the State to alert the owners of livestock and other animals of potential nearby consumer fireworks use prior to such use.

After reviewing the report, the joint standing committee may report out legislation relating to the report to the First Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.'

On or before January 15, 2023, the State Fire Marshal is required to submit to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice and public safety matters a report outlining the findings and any recommendations of the stakeholder group, including any proposed legislation, and the committee is authorized to report out legislation relating to the report to the First Regular Session of the 131st Legislature.
