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1	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §4105 is enacted to read:
3	§4105. School buildings used for purposes other than instruction
4	If a school administrative unit intends to retain a school building that is no longer
5	being used for the instruction of students, the school administrative unit shall obtain prior
6	voter approval pursuant to the provisions of section 4102, subsection 4, paragraphs A and
7	B. The article to be voted on must be substantially in the following form:
8	"Article: Do you favor authorizing the school committee of
