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SENATE AMENDMENT

1	SUMMARY
2	Under current law, the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices
3	determines distribution amounts for candidates by looking at certain factors, including
4	campaign expenditures from the Maine Clean Election Fund from the 2 previous election
5	cycles. This amendment repeals the requirement that distributions during the 2012
6	election cycle must be reduced by 5% from the amounts distributed during the 2010
7	election cycle. This amendment provides a set amount for distributions for the 2012 and
8	2014 election cycles, including \$1,500 for candidates for the State House of
9	Representatives and \$6,000 for candidates for the State Senate in a contested election
10	during the primary election cycle, which will be used when determining future
11	distributions, and maintains the single distribution proposal included in the bill. The
12 13	amendment also doubles the amount of seed money contributions legislative candidates may receive. It replaces the appropriations and allocations section of the bill.
