Our company's vision is that our kids, grandkids, and future generations will enjoy a clean environment and just society throughout New England, and this can only be accomplished by closing the last youth prison in Maine and reinvesting in our communities to support our youth.

Located just across the street from ReVision Energy's South Portland shop, our co-owners pass by Long Creek each day. This space is part of our community. For too long, leaders at all levels have tried to mitigate crime by pumping more money into police departments and prisons instead of investing in community programs, such as job training and mental health services, to combat the root causes.
