## §12995. Definitions

As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings. [PL 2025, c. 324, §1 (NEW).]

1. Authority. "Authority" means the Finance Authority of Maine. [PL 2025, c. 324, §1 (NEW).]

2. Eligible student loan. "Eligible student loan" means an undergraduate or graduate school student loan obtained for study at an accredited institution of higher education by a student eligible to receive assistance under a federal student assistance program authorized under the federal Higher Education Act of 1965, Title IV.

**3. Fund.** "Fund" means the Maine Credentialed Workforce Program Fund established in section 12997.

**4. Priority occupation.** "Priority occupation" means a profession needing skilled workers as identified by the authority in consultation with workforce experts and in the Department of Economic and Community Development publication "Maine Economic Development Strategy 2020-2029," or successor economic development strategy for the State.

**5. Program.** "Program" means the Maine Credentialed Workforce Program established in section 12996.
