In Senate Chamber Tuesday January 10, 2006

Senate called to order by President Beth Edmonds of Cumberland County.

Prayer by Reverend Carl Geores, Presbyterian Mission at the Eastward in Monmouth.

REVEREND GEORES: I'm happy to be here this morning. I've been asked to give a spiritual message. That's what I'm going to try to do.

My wife and I arrived here with our family in 1952 in Leeds, Maine. Maine was a different place then, as some of you may remember. Our town was a poor town. It was \$1,000 below the average income in the State of Maine. As I called on the community, I saw that many people worked hard but all they earned was a subsistence living. As I worked and met them and saw them I realized that many had substandard housing. This came to a crisis point in my life in 1963 when we had a blizzard, that some of you lived through then. We had 60 mile per hour winds, 10 below zero. A bitter night. A family had moved over on the River Road in Leeds to live in an abandoned woods camp. There were four children, a mother, and a father. The father was out of work. There was no insulation, no chimney, no water, and no electricity. I went over there after the storm was over and I talked with Clara, the mother, and she said it was 8° above zero that morning inside her house. With that kind of motivation, we said we had to do something. The men of the church got together and they met that emergency need. We learned that by working together we could accomplish a lot.

As we looked around the community we saw that there was all kinds of needs for housing. Working with the Farmer's Home Administration; Cooperative Extension; and the forerunner of the Community Action Program, the Androscoggin County Taskforce on Social Welfare Incorporated, they hired a worker to work with low-income people. Two small groups were organized. They built brand new homes with their own sweat equity. Again, we learned that by working together much could be accomplished.

In 1970, ministers and laypeople from Roman Catholic churches, Baptist churches, Presbyterian churches, Methodist, Congregational, and Community churches organized the Rural Community Action Ministry. We learned that by working together we could work with the Tri-County Mental Health Association and get a pass-through counselor, which we all needed. We learned that by working with the Community Action Program we could build houses. Along that line, we discovered that by working together everybody wins.

Is it easy? It's not easy. Is it worth doing? You bet. That is what the people of Maine expect us to do; to work together for the common good. I know that this is on your minds and in your hearts and you will have to work hard to see that it gets done. Let us pray.

Help us, oh God, to have the courage and integrity to work together for the people of Maine. Help us to remember the poor, the homeless, the mentally ill, the disabled, as well as those who are able to care for themselves. Help us to be just and fair in our decision-making. Help us to listen to one another and remember that we are really only neighbors with a common need to work for all the people of our state. Amen.
