THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Washington, Senator Raye.

Senator **RAYE**: Thank you, Madame President, men and women of the Senate. I rise to speak on the pending motion. Given the committee vote, I recognize that L.D. 1332 will not be enacted, but prior to action by this body I would like to establish certain facts for the record.

By way of background, this bill arises from a longstanding injustice whereby western Washington County, the area from Lubec to Cherryfield, is the only region in the state of Maine without a career and technical education facility for its high school students. In response to this situation, there has been an ongoing effort in Washington County for a number of years to insure that such a facility is built. Formerly Maine law required that a percentage of school construction funds be set aside for the construction of career and technical education facilities, formerly known as vocational education facilities. Once these centers were built throughout the state, the law was changed and the requirement was dropped. The problem is that one region, and only one region, of Maine was left behind because its facility was not built before the law was changed. That region is the area from Lubec to Cherryfield. Finally, after these many years of efforts to rectify this situation, I brought this bill forward last year

in an effort to correct that injustice legislatively. However, after the recent work session on L.D. 1332, the majority of the Education Committee voted an Ought Not to Pass report. It is my understanding that this vote was the result of a determination by the committee that this bill is now unnecessary because Machias has an application pending for school construction funds that can fund both the new high school in Machias and the career and technical education facility in Jonesboro.

Madame President, may I direct a question through the Chair for the Chair of the Education Committee?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may proceed.

Senator **RAYE**: Thank you, Madame President. Would it be possible, for the benefit of the Senate and for the official legislative record, for the Senator to characterize comments made by members of the Education Committee, the testimony offered by the Education Department, and comments provided on behalf of the State Board of Education during the consideration of this bill?

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Mitchell.

Senator MITCHELL: Thank you, Madame President and distinguished colleagues of the Senate and to my good colleague from Washington County. The Education Committee, by the vote that appears on your calendar and which is an Ought Not to Pass, in no way is opposed to the construction of a vocational center in Washington County. We concur with the good Senator from Washington County that this is a long-standing error that needs to be corrected. It is the only county in the state without such a center. The question that arose in our committee was how to proceed in a responsible fashion. As has been pointed out, the center in Machias is number eleven on the list of schools to be funded and it is almost guaranteed that they will get to that number. As a matter of fact, there is a bill pending in this session to increase the debt limit so that we can go beyond that. This is on the first level of protected schools in terms of those that will go forward. The voters in 2005 also approved a \$1 million bond to construct a Sunrise Development Center in the Jonesboro area. The opportunity now, and this is what the Commissioner of Education and the State Board of Education indicated they were supportive of, is working with all the communities in Washington County to pool these resources to make sure that this happens. We concur with the good Senator that this must be done. We applaud his advocacy on behalf of his county and believe that this will be a reality in the very near future. This bill, however, would complicate matters more. Again, I believe it would be unanimous report of our committee in support of this effort to go forward but we chose to vote against this bill with the assurances of the State Board of Education and the Department of Education that this is a top priority, recognizing the needs of the students in that county.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Washington, Senator Raye.

Senator **RAYE**: Thank you, Madame President. I appreciate the good words of the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Mitchell. I am grateful for her thoughtful leadership on the Education Committee and understanding the need that exists for this career and technical education facility in western Washington County.

Madame President, may I direct another question through the Chair to the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Turner?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may proceed.

Senator RAYE: Thank you, Madame President. The Senator from Kennebec, Senator Mitchell, referenced the school construction application submitted by Machias. This application has twin goals of a new high school in Machias and the vocational and technical education facility in nearby Jonesboro. Neighboring school districts have come together, cooperatively, to help pave the way for this important step for Washington County education. In numerous discussions with the Machias and the SAD 37 school committee and Superintendent, the Commissioner of Education has indicated that the Machias application can be the vehicle for construction of both facilities. Given the vote of the Education Committee, I think it's important for the legislative record to reflect the current understanding of this matter. Madame President, my question is as follows; is it the Senator's understanding that the application submitted by Machias can result in the construction of both the Machias High School and the career and technical education center at Jonesboro?

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair will remind members that when they are directing a question through the Chair it can be to any Senator, but I am pleased to recognize the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Turner.

Senator TURNER: Thank you, Madame President. I'd like to rise in response to the question posed by the Senator from Washington, Senator Raye. It is, in fact, my understanding that the application submitted by Machias can result in the construction of both facilities. I have concluded, as a result, that L.D. 1332 is no longer necessary for us to consider. It is further my understanding that there are legal requirements that need to be addressed in order for this to happen. This will involve local decisions and the effected communities to put in place the legal authorization for the Machias school committee, which is the designated vocational center for the region, to construct a career and technical facility on land that has been jointly purchased by the Machias school committee and SAD 37 school committee for that purpose in the town of Jonesboro. It would appear to me that as long as those steps are taken successfully at the local level, our expectation that both facilities should, in fact, come to fruition. Having listened to the testimony of the Senator from Washington, Senator Raye, and others from Washington County as well as the insurances offered from the department and the State Board of Education, I certainly hope and expect that this will be the case. Thank you very much, Madame President.
