In accordance with 3 MRSA §995.4, I respectfully submit OPEGA's Annual Report on Activities and Performance for 2009. This month marks the fifth anniversary of OPEGA's service to the Legislature as a non-partisan resource meant to provide support in overseeing and improving the performance of State government. Throughout those five years, the OPEGA staff and I have remained committed to being meaningful contributors to the practice of good government in the State of Maine.

This report illustrates where we stand on the performance measures related to the short-term objectives established in our Strategic Plan which was approved by the Government Oversight Committee and implemented by the Office in 2009.
