In accordance with 3 M.R.S.A., Chapter 6, Section 158, and with Joint Rule 506 of the  $130^{th}$  Legislature, the vote was taken by the Yeas and Nays.

The Doorkeepers secured the Chamber.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Oxford, Senator Bennett.

Senator BENNETT: Thank you, Mr. President. When you all leave the Chamber in a few minutes you will find two gifts in celebration of Earth Day for each of you on the table just outside the Chamber. One gift is a lovely handcrafted bouquet that the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Brenner, has made for you from flowers grown at her Broadturn farm. The other is a mug of herbs grown by the Allen Day Community Garden that I procured with the help of the Fair Share Co-op in Norway, both wonderful contributing organizations in the Oxford Hills. Please take these gifts with Senator Brenner's and my compliments. On this day in 1970, Democrat Senator Gaylord Nelson and Republican Congressman Pete McCloskey co-Chaired the first Earth Day. More than 20 million Americans responded by taking to the streets, the parks, and the classrooms in support of a healthy environment. Here we are, 51 years on, and Earth Day is widely recognized, the largest secular observance in the world, marked by more than a billion people across 190 countries each year. Earth Day still serves as a day of action to change human behavior and create global, national, and local policy changes, but it has become something more and something deeper. It is a moment for us, collectively, to pause in gratitude and reverence for our sacred planet, nourishing and giving us life. We're all grateful for the bountiful gifts of Maine's outdoors, our clean waters, open air, and precious land. We ask you to join us in expressing thanks for these blessings.

**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Brenner.

Senator **BRENNER**: Thank you, President Jackson. Thank you, Senator Bennett, and I want to bring greetings from the Environment and Natural Resources Committee with my Senate Lead. On April 22, 1970, John Lindsay, the Mayor of New York City, addressed a crowd in Union Square, in what was an essential moment for an elected official, to raise awareness about our planet. It was a beautiful spring day in the park. Lindsay said, 'The more beautiful it can look on an occasion like this the more we are reminded that the business of pollution is the twin brother of the business of poverty and despair.' Since then, Earth Day has followed the arc of our societal awareness of understanding our role in protecting our planet. From its initial origins of litter to a concern about toxins, and now mitigating climate change, we have a profound responsibility as a Legislative Body to remind ourselves health and wellness starts with the sacredness of earth and water and air. May we all move together in the direction of harnessing our knowledge and capacity to realize the bi-partisan roots of Earth Day, collectively and deliberately, and let's remember John Lindsay's words as we work for environmental justice for all of Maine's people. Happy Earth Day.

**THE PRESIDENT**: Judging by the wind outside, I think the Earth definitely appreciates the Senator from Oxford and the Senator from Cumberland words today and certainly the Chair appreciates it and appreciates the gifts that you've left for us. Thank you so much.
