THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Washington, Senator Raye.

Senator RAYE: Thank you, Madame President. I wanted to address the Senate briefly prior to our action on this Resolve. I want to thank members of leadership on both sides of the aisle. Particularly, in addition to that, I want to thank the Senator from

Piscataquis, Senator Smith, and the Senate from Knox, Senator Rector, for some very good discussions we had around this issue in the days since the Joint Select Committee on Maine's Energy Future acted on it. This Resolve establishes the responsibility of the legislature to do our part to ensure the wise and responsible use of funds that come in State coffers for energy related issues as the result of the passage of the Federal Stimulus law. We are committed to ensuring that it is used as quickly as practically possible. This should in no way delay prompt action but it should insure thoughtful action. It is clear that the intent of our passage of this Resolve is to help ensure that the Federal Economic Stimulus in no way exacerbates the structural gap in our own state budget going forward. We recognize this is one-time, short term funding and we must guard against using it in any other way. I thought it was important that, as we act on this, the record reflect this as we move forward. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Bartlett.

Senator BARTLETT: Thank you, Madame President. This Resolve comes out of the work of the newly created Joint Select Committee on Maine's Energy Future and represents a bipartisan commitment to make sure as money comes flowing in from the federal government for energy related purposes that we have an opportunity to step back and make sure that those monies are spent in a way that are one-time but are also consistent with our overall strategy as we look forward. Our goal this session, I think on both sides of the aisle, is to come together with a long-term energy plan with short-term components and long-term components to make sure we are helping to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels and to make sure we are lowering energy costs to Maine consumers. This is designed to be a part of that overall plan and strategy. I look forward to the opportunity to work with everybody in this Body as well as our friends at the other end of the hall to make sure that we are working together in a cooperative spirit to make sure that these monies are put to the maximum use to lower energy costs for Maine's people. Thank you.

This being an Emergency Measure and having received the affirmative vote of 29 Members of the Senate, with no Senators having voted in the negative, and 29 being more than two-thirds of the entire elected Membership of the Senate, was FINALLY PASSED and having been signed by the President, was presented by the Secretary to the Governor for his approval.
