THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Cushing.

Senator **CUSHING**: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I rise today to pay homage to a man who lived a full and productive life and left a legacy that, although of a simple nature, leaves a message for all who wish to to learn something by. I'd like to share with you a brief poem that I received from a friend that I think clearly indicates something that highlights my father-in-law's life and also how we may reflect on our lives. It's called <u>The Dash</u> and it was written by Linda Ellis.

Consider the implications of your own life's choices. I read of a man who stood to speak at the funeral of a friend. He referred to the dates on her tombstone from the beginning to the end. He noted that first came the date of her birth and spoke of the following date with tears, but he said what mattered most was the dash between those years. The dash represents all the time that she spent alive on earth and now only those who loved her know what the little line is worth, for it matters not how much we own, the cars, the house, the cash. What matters is how we live and love and how we spend our dash. So think about this long and hard. Are there things you'd like to change? For you never know how much time is left. You could be at dash mid-range. If we could just slow down enough to consider what is true and real and to always try to understand the way other people feel and be less quick to anger and show appreciation more and love the people in our lives like we've never loved before. If we treat each other with respect and more often wear a smile, remembering that this special dash might only last a little while. So when your eulogy is being read, with your life's actions to rehash, would you be proud of things they say about how you spent your dash.

Gerald Crommett was one of those who lived his dash well. Like many in our state, he came from humble beginnings and earned his living through hard work and perseverance. Still, at 75 years of age, he was, in fact, heading to work on the morning that his life ended. He built a large business that brokered millions of pounds of fish to various parts of the world, but he chose to stay in his hometown of Passadumkeag and never lost his connection to Maine. He shared generously with his community, providing jobs for many many young people over the years, and always tried to find the best in those he dealt with. He loved life and his family and worked tirelessly to provide both a good living and a good life for them. I'm both proud and honored to have known this man and had the privilege of being part of his extended family. On a personal note, I wish to express our gratitude for all of those of you and others who offered us their support, prayers, and best wishes during this difficult time. It's easier to carry these burdens when others help with the load. To the many friends and neighbors who helped with the search and the final preparations. words cannot express our thanks. For the authorities who served us, the State Police, the sheriff's department, and especially the Warden's Service, you have our respect and profound gratitude for your professional and compassionate service. In closing, I leave you with one of my father-in-law's favorite quotes, which captures the essence of how he lived, "You can't be a beacon if your light don't shine." Thank you, Mr. President.

Senator THIBODEAU: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I just rise this afternoon to just point out and thank the Administration and the Chief Executive for bringing forward this very important bill. The efforts and hard work that went into that on Friday should not go unnoticed. I want to thank you, Mr. President, for your willingness to work with us and bring forward a piece of legislation that is very important to the people of the state of Maine. I think each one of us has received tremendous amounts of e-mails and personal contacts about this issue. I know that Senator Jackson's willingness to sponsor this legislation was tremendously important because him being involved in the shepherding through of this bill through the processes was incredibly important. I would also recognize that is an event that, well, is rare; to take a bill in one day and get it down to the Governor's Office, to the Chief Executive, for his signature. I applaud your efforts, each and every one of you that was involved in this process. You know, just a few weeks ago we began the 126th Maine Legislature and we were all told that it was going to be the most divisive Legislature that there had been in years, and maybe in the history of the institution, and that we couldn't work together, that we couldn't resolve the issues, and that it would be a very partisan battle. Who could have imagined that our very first opportunity to have a roll call vote would result in a bill that was brought forward by the Chief Executive, sponsored by the Majority Party, and, indeed, probably will receive unanimous support here in the Senate. I think it's a day that the folks back home would be very proud of this institution. I'm incredibly proud of this institution for having taken the action that they have. With that, Mr. President, I would request a roll

It's a just over 60 day temporary measure that will allow that to happen. I think that it's important that we take this step forward. I think it's important that we recognize the importance of each of our

opinions, concerns about public safety, and concerns about Right To Know, as well as the larger conversation that we're having here in the state as well as around the country. For that reason, Mr. President, I would encourage all of us to support this bill.
