JOINT RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING THE BOSTON RED SOX ON THEIR WINNING THE 2013 WORLD SERIES

WHEREAS, on October 30, 2013, the Boston Red Sox won the 2013 World Series by defeating the St. Louis Cardinals at Fenway Park, winning the series for the first time in Boston since 1918; and

RESOLVED: That We, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-sixth Legislature now assembled in the Second Regular Session, on behalf of the people we represent, extend our congratulations to all the members of the Boston Red Sox on their winning the 2013 World Series and bringing the championship title back to New England; and be it further

RESOLVED: That a suitable copy of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Boston Red Sox with the best wishes of the people of Maine for future victories.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Aroostook, Senator Jackson.

Senator **JACKSON**: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I really just wanted to quickly get up and say that I know that probably many of us in this Chamber are, but being a lifelong Red Sox fan, certainly way back in '86 and having the heartbreak of '86, 2003 waiting up until, I think, 2 o'clock in the morning, hoping for all hope that they were going to beat the Yankees and go to the World Series and being so ready to call all my Yankee friends as soon as that happened. Again, having that snatched away. Certainly over the last 10 years, having this being the third World Series title, I'm certainly someone that doesn't like to use their position of authority or position in the Legislature to make anything, but I've got to say to all my Yankee friends that I think today I got the last laugh. I'm very excited that the Red Sox again are World Series champions. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Kennebec, Senator Katz.

Senator **KATZ**: Thank you Mr. President. Men and women of the Senate, we all just watched the ball go through Senator Jackson's legs but it could happen to anybody. I started going to see the Red Sox in April of 1955. I'll never forget that first day, as I'm sure most of you won't forget your first time at Fenway. Leaving Augusta, where the grass was brown, and going to Fenway and walking up through the tunnel. It was like the opening scene in Oz in the Wizard of Oz. The emerald green of the grass and the big wall. That was the beginning a real love affair for me, and I'm sure for many of us who have had similar experiences. Some of

us have lived longer than others and lived through years of Ted Williams and Jackie Jensen and Jim Lonborg and Carl Yastrzemski and suffered through year after year of not winning the World Series. Finally, this century has been good; 2004, 2007, and 2013. It's been a good run for the Red Sox and hopefully we'll add 2014 to it. I understand that Senator Jackson has taken money out of his PAC and chartering a bus and all of us can go with him down to deliver this Resolution to Boston.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Tuttle.

Senator TUTTLE: Thank you Mr. President. Members of the Senate, my brother is a Yankee fan and he still hasn't gotten over 2003 yet. I was surprised the first time I heard it said the Red Sox were going to win by Senator Katz last year. I said, "Roger, there's no way after the season before." Roger, I'll be listening to you more often in the near future. When I'm not up here I'm an emergency medical technician. I deal with a lot of patients and I had a patient by the name of Jean from Cumberland. He was a great Red Sox fan. In 2002, when they lost to the Yankees in the seventh game, he was very depressed. I said, "You know, Jean, we're lucky that they made it that far and we can say they had a good season." He said, "John, no way. They lost. They have to win." Jean passed away the following month, but I know that when they won in 2003 that he was happy. Also my father-in-law was a great Red Sox fan and he passed away in June. After they won the World Series I got a Red Sox banner and placed it on his grave. I think for a lot of us the Red Sox are our team and, Roger, I'll be listening to you more often.
