You know, the argument for this legislation really revolves around the appearance of impropriety and we've seen now in two states with - from two different political parties concerns about in the states of Arizona and in Georgia a Secretary of State basically

being the Presiding Officer of certifying their own election to the office of Governor in those states. Whether anything improper took place or not in these states, there certainly has been a cause for question and the question of is it appropriate for a Secretary of State to be signing off on their own election in a hotly contested race like those were and is that something that we, by our current system, are opening ourselves up to as the State of Maine? So, this legislation was brought forward to try to address that before it ever becomes a problem in our state and that's why I oppose the pending motion and would support the alternate report. Thank you, Mr. President.

THE PRESIDENT: The pending question before the Senate is Acceptance of the Majority Ought Not to Pass Report. A roll call has been ordered. Is the Senate ready for the question?
