JOINT RESOLUTION MEMORIALIZING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO RAISE THE WEIGHT LIMIT ON INTERSTATE 95

WE, your Memorialists, the Members of the One Hundred and Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Maine now assembled in the First Regular Session, most respectfully present and petition the President of the United States and the United States Congress as follows:

WHEREAS, Interstate 95 in the State of Maine, which is part of the Dwight D. Eisenhower System of Interstate and Defense Highways and is governed by the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1956, is central to Maine's commerce and industry; and

WHEREAS, the weight limit on the Interstate Highway System is set at 80,000 pounds by the Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1956 and consequently by Maine statute, yet the State of Maine has a 100,000-pound limit on its secondary roads, which does not match the national limit; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government has given the State of Maine an exemption, which allows for a 100,000-pound limit, from the 80,000-pound limit to the last 5 miles of the Maine Turnpike and Interstate 95, and this exemption matches the limit for the rest of the State; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That We, your Memorialists, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to request that the United States Congress allow the State of Maine a 100,000-pound limit on all of the Interstate Highway System in Maine and that the United States Congress review this request when the Highway Bill comes up for reauthorization; and be it further

RESOLVED: That suitable copies of this resolution, duly authenticated by the Secretary of State, be transmitted to the Honorable Barack H. Obama, President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives and to each Member of the Maine Congressional Delegation.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider.

Senator SCHNEIDER: Thank you, Madame President. Men and women of the Senate, first I would like to thank all of you for working with me supporting this Joint Resolution. We are sending a powerful message on to our President and Congress, lending our voices, calling for change to raise the weight limit on I-95 to 100,000 pounds for the entire I-95 corridor. This change will save lives by getting our large trucks off local roads and putting them onto I-95. It will save money and help small businesses by putting those trucks onto I-95 by saving fuel, lessening our carbon footprint, and together we will make Maine a stronger state by enacting this change. I call also on all of you to get in touch directly with our Congressional delegation to speak with them about this change, to let them know that we are supportive of their efforts in Congress that they are currently undertaking to make this change occur. I thank you for your help with this and I appreciate the opportunity to speak.

Off Record Remarks

At this point a message was received from the House of Representatives, borne by Representative PIOTTI of Unity informing the Senate that the House concurred with the proposition for a Convention of the two branches of the Legislature to be held in the Hall of the House at 11:00 in the morning for the purpose of extending to the Honorable John Fitzsimmons, President of the Maine Community College System, and the Honorable Richard L. Pattenaude, Chancellor of the University of Maine System, an invitation to attend and to make such communication as pleases them.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Plowman.

Senator PLOWMAN: Thank you, Madame President. I rise to endorse, with my whole heart, this Joint Resolution. In 1994 one of my constituents died in her bed on Rt. 9 in Dixmont when a truck went through her house and took her and her bed into the basement because the 100,000 pound truck that was force to use Rt. 9 had nowhere to go when a car pulled out a little bit in front of them. In approximately 1997 a UPS driver burned to death in his truck on Rt. 9 in Hampden when a 100,000 pound truck hit him as he tried to make deliveries. Two years ago Susan G. Abraham of Hampden, Maine was killed when a 100,000 pound truck that should have been on the Interstate making a delivery to the landfill hit her. These trucks have nowhere to go. They have no reaction time. They do not belong on our streets. In Bangor a truck that was forced to not use I-395 because it was more than 80,000 pounds ran over an elderly woman standing on the corner in downtown Bangor. Since 1994 I've been collecting signatures and sending letters to Representative Oberstar asking him why our people, my people, my constituents, are dying. It's very emotional. It's not just a truck. It's not just economy. It's how do I go and look someone in the eye and say that since 1994 I've been asking for this. How do I look at my friend, Carol Abraham, and say, 'I'm sorry, Carol.' That truck should have gotten off at Dysarts, turned left, and traveled three-quarters of a mile on local roads. I should have never been on 40 miles of back road. This can't be done soon enough. I don't know what your roads are like, but I know the people Rt. 9. I can't handle writing one more letter to Representative Oberstar. It hurts me. It doesn't seem to hurt him. Thank you.
