Dear President Jackson, Speaker Talbot Ross, Senator Lawrence, and Representative Zeigler:

I am pleased to submit this report in accordance with the Petroleum Market Share Act (PMSA), 10 M.R.S.A. § 1677. The PMSA requires the Attorney General to make a report to the Legislature describing the concentration of retail outlets in the State, including a recommendation as to whether additional legislation is needed to further limit or curtail the activity of refiners operating retail outlets.

Enclosed is a report describing concentration of retail outlets in the State. The report, which is based on data collected from wholesalers of both motor fuel oil and home heating oil, includes maps depicting relative concentration in designated markets throughout the State. This report is also available on the Attorney General's website: Office of the Maine AG: Consumer Protection: Antitrust.

Because no refiners of petroleum products operate retail outlets m this State, we recommend no legislation to limit or curtail such operations.

Senator BEEBE-CENTER: Thank you, Mr. President. I am honored to be here today to recognize Maddie and her accomplishments. Maddie is currently a Junior at Oceanside High School in Rockland. Maddie has been wrestling for 13 vears, so to say that she has some experience with the sport with this sport would be an understatement. Due to the pandemic, Maddie was unable to wrestle her freshman year, but she immediately jumped at the opportunity to wrestle again for her sophomore year. During that time, she was the runner-up at the co-ed State Championship, placed first at co-ed Regionals, and was the first girl to ever win the Kennebec Valley All-County Championship in the state. Her success didn't stop there. She was placed fourth at co-ed All-States, placed first in girls States, and won the New England Tournament in the 113-pound weight class. Keep in mind, this was all just her sophomore year. This past year, she entered the 106-pound weight class and once again won the co-ed Regional Championship and was the first girl in Maine's history to win the co-ed State Championship. Not stopping there, she also once again won the girls State Championship, became an All-American, and placed second at Virginia Beach Nationals. She has already accomplished so much, but she continues to aim high and plans to go to school to become a registered nurse. Maddie serves as an inspiration for countless women in Maine. Maddie, I think I speak for everyone here when I say we can't wait to see what you do next.

Senator INGWERSEN: Thank you, Mr. President. It is my honor today to recognize this distinguished member of our community, Carmen Bernier, who has made significant contributions to our state's electoral system. Carmen is a former Biddeford City Clerk who has worked tirelessly for the City of Biddeford for 28 years, 15 as a City Clerk, to make sure that our elections are free, fair. and accessible to all. Carmen's dedication to public service has spanned over several years, during which time she has served as an election official, overseeing voter registration drives, and worked on important election reforms alongside Secretary of State Shenna Bellows and with former Speaker of the House Ryan Fecteau. Specifically, Carmen Bernier spearheaded a successful pilot project on absentee voting in Biddeford that proved to be a great help for senior citizens. The results of this initiative were so impressive that it led to the Maine Legislature passing a bipartisan bill based on Bernier's innovative approach. This was just the beginning of her ongoing efforts to improve voting access and convenience. Thanks to her advocacy, a state law was passed that provided for ongoing absentee voting for all of our senior citizens. This law was built on the foundation of a pilot program that she had conducted in Biddeford. Her work on this initiative earned her praise from the Secretary of State Shenna Bellows who credited her with playing a pivotal role in achieving bipartisan support for the legislation. Carmen's expertise, experience, and commitment to democracy have been invaluable to our state and she's been a leading voice in advocating for greater voter access and participation. Her tireless work on issues such as early voting, same-day registration, and automatic voter registration have helped ensure that Maine residents have the opportunity to exercise their right to vote. It is

for these reasons that Carmen Bernier recently received the Lorraine M. Fleury Award for her tireless efforts to improve the electoral process in Maine. Each year, the Secretary of State solicits nominations for the award, named for a long-time State Director of Elections, Lorraine M. Fleury. The award is presented to recognize and honor an individual who has made a significant contribution to the election process and who exemplifies the qualities of fairness, experience, knowledge, and service. In recognition for her outstanding contributions to our state, I would like to commend Carmen for her dedication to public service and her tireless efforts to improve the electoral process in Maine. Her commitment to democracy is an inspiration to us all and we are grateful for her service to our state. This legislation simply directs the state auditor to put a report together on where our taxpayer money is going to all these various nonprofits just so that we, as legislators, can have more information in the decisions that we make in terms of how dollars are appropriated. So, that being the case, I will be voting against the Ought Not to Pass motion and voting for a little more transparency to support the Ought to Pass Report. Thank you.

Senator **NANGLE**: Thank you, Mr. President.
