Joint Order

On motion by Senator **GERZOFSKY** of Cumberland, the following Joint Order:

S.P. 29

ORDERED, the House concurring, that the Joint Rules be amended by adding Joint Rule 319 to read:

Rule 319. Review of provisions creating or enhancing criminal penalties.

Whenever a legislative proposal in a resolve or bill, including a budget bill, enacts a new crime or increases the penalty for an existing crime, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over the proposal shall hold a public hearing and determine the level of support for the proposal among members of the committee. If there is support for the proposal among a majority of the members of the committee, the committee shall request the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice and public safety matters to review and evaluate the proposal for its impact on the criminal justice system. The joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over criminal justice and public safety matters shall conduct the review and report back to the joint standing committee of jurisdiction and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs.

READ.

Pursuant to Joint Rule 102 a Division was had. 32 Members of the Senate having voted in the affirmative, and no Senators having voted in the negative, and 32 being more than two-thirds of those present and voting, the Joint Order was **PASSED**.

On motion by Senator **GERZOFSKY** of Cumberland, the following Joint Order:

S.P. 31

ORDERED, the House concurring, that by March 1, 2014, the Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety, after consultation with the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary and the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs, shall submit legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 126th Legislature establishing the Criminal Code Revision Commission, for the purpose of reviewing, revising, unifying, recodifying and consolidating Maine's criminal laws, including, but not limited to, the Maine Criminal Code. The commission shall:

1. Examine all sections of the Maine Criminal Code and all criminal statutes not contained in the Maine Criminal Code;

2. Evaluate the operation of the Maine Criminal Code in an effort to revise the Maine Criminal Code as necessary to ensure clarity, consistency, generalization in defining prohibited conduct, proportionality of the penalties and punishments to the offense and equity in sentencing. The commission shall recommend amendments to the Maine Criminal Code based on the evaluation and amendments to those Maine criminal statutes not contained in the Maine Criminal Code; and

3. Examine any other aspects of Maine's criminal laws, including substantive, procedural and administrative matters, that the commission determines relevant.

The legislation must provide that the Criminal Code Revision Commission may accept federal and other grants to carry out its responsibilities.
