On September 11, 2001, terrorists hijacked four airplanes and forcibly crashed them into American soil: the World Trade Center in New York City, the Pentagon in the Commonwealth of Virginia and in a field near Shanksville in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

There were more than 3,000 innocent people, including people from our State of Maine and many other states and countries, who were killed as a result of these atrocities; and

We, Senators in the State of Maine, feel compassion and sympathy for the families and friends of those who so tragically lost their lives in these events; and

We wish to recognize the sacrifice of the thousands of first responders and citizens who immediately and selflessly rushed to the assistance of those suffering in those disasters; and We wish to honor those who gave their lives as they helped in the rescue efforts in the wake of these events; and

Many citizens of Maine and America volunteered to assist in the long-term recovery of families and first responders affected by these catastrophes; and

The people of Maine are appreciative of the sacrifices of the United States Army, the volunteers of the Maine Army National Guard and the Maine Air National Guard and that their families have made in order to protect our freedoms; and

The people of Maine have the utmost respect for all the individuals who put their lives in danger for the sake of the freedoms enjoyed by all Americans; and

That We, the Members of the Maine State Senate of the One Hundred and Twenty-second Legislature, on behalf of the people we represent, take this opportunity to express our sympathy to the families and friends of those killed in the disasters of September 11, 2001 and our overwhelming appreciation to those who helped in the immediate response and long-term recovery from those events.
